UPDATE ON MORGAN HILL PONY BASEBALL FIELD USAGE

RECOMMENDATION(S)

1. Receive report on Morgan Hill Pony Baseball (MHPB) field usage at Community Park
2. Recommend approval a 50% reduction in field rental fees based on improvements made to fields

REPORT NARRATIVE:

Morgan Hill PONY Baseball (MHPB) has offered a program for the area's youth since 1974. MHPB is a member of the national organization, PONY Baseball, Inc. PONY is an acronym for Protect Our Nations Youth. Morgan Hill PONY Baseball seeks to impart the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty, courage and respect for authority MHPB is the designated Partner Organization of the City of Morgan Hill as designated by the the Parks and Recreation Commission based on the number of residents served, historical delivery of services, and commitment to providing both recreational and competitive athletic opportunities as explained in the current Parks and Sport Field Use Operation Policies and Procedures.

In previous years, prior to 2023, MHPB has utilized fields the organization's home fields at Britton Middle School as well as use of practice fields at Community Park and Galvan Park. As the PONY program has continued to grow, the need for additional permanent and on-going basis has increased. At the end of their 2022 season, Morgan Hill Pony Baseball reached out to City of Morgan Hill staff in regard to renting field space on a continuous basis at Community Park.

Currently, the City only does limited ball field maintenance and infield prep at most twice per year, as the maintenance resources for Park maintenance are extremely limited. MHPB proposed assisting the city in the ongoing maintenance as well as one time improvements on the Community Park fields that would be of benefit to MHPB and the entire sports community. In exchange for these improvements Pony requested reduced field rental rates up to fifty percent (50%). This arrangement was approved by City staff for a for a trial year in 2023. The additional terms MHPB agreed to are listed below:

- 1. MHPB must leave one weeknight (Wednesdays) available with no Pony activities, for City booking of softball league and other programs.
- 2. All times reserved must be utilized by MHPB only (no sub-renting permitted), times that are not used should be released back to the City.

- 3. MHPB required to post monthly schedule at fields for community access.
- 4. MHPB agrees to pay the current hourly field and field light rates. Rental rates shall be reduced by a maximum of 50% based on the value park improvements completed by Morgan Hill Pony Baseball that support community use at the facility. Field lighting rates are not eligible for reduction.
- Rate reductions shall occur following verification of improvement dollars spent.
- 5. Fees would be due quarterly ahead of each quarter.
- 6. MHPB agrees to provide all booking dates by October 1st for the following calendar year.
- 7. Calendar must include and identify the start and end of dates for each season (spring & fall).
- Not to exceed 12 weekends between February-May (Spring) and 10 weekends between September- November
- (Fall)
- 8. MHPB can add additional weekend dates if dates are available after January 15 of each year.
- 9. MHPB agrees to leave fields in usable conditions when not in use by MHPB.
- 10. All improvements must be submitted to Public Services Director for approval.
- 11. Improvements will require a City encroachment permit/agreement by MHPB (no fees for this permit if it does not impact park operations). The City would conduct safety inspections on projects.
- Building permits may also be required depending on project (fees are required for building permit).
- 12. MHPB would be responsible for cleaning and maintenance of the concession stand in as-is- condition.
- 13. MHPB can operate concession stand with valid operating permits. Use of concession stand would only be during scheduled use of the fields.
- 14. Concession stand is a shared-use facility; other users can operate on weekends MHPB is not utilizing.

The trial season started in February 2023. In March, community members shared with the Parks and Recreation Commission frustration with MHPB utilizing all the fields. During that time, city teammates worked with MHPB and community members to ensure drop in use of fields by individuals were more than welcome, even if Pony had time booked and the fields were not in use. No other issues or concerns were brought to the attention of staff after the initial comments in early 2023. MHPB has maintained the terms listed above.

Over the course of the year, MHPB has made improvements to maintain and preserve the fields at Community Park. Some of the work they have done includes weed removal, dirt treatment, field dragging, water removal and shed cleaning. They also repaired the netting around the fields. The total estimated hours for these improvements are just over 200. This volunteer work is outlined in Attachment 1. MHPB had also planned to do a major infield update project in 2023, but that work has not occurred and it is intended to be completed in 2024. The City anticipates that project occurring in the coming

months.

For 2024, MHPB intends to continue to improve maintenance of the fields as well as new improvements, including the replacement of the infields on two of the fields.

The field rental fees are revenue associated with the operating budget for the Recreation Division. Providing up to a 50% reduction in fees to MHPB will not result in less revenue for the Department, as the use even at 50% of fees is more use than traditionally booked on the fields. The fields will take moderately more wear and tear, but that is offset by the maintenance work that MHPB will complete that would otherwise not occur.

RECOMMENDATION

City staff are asking the Parks and Recreation Commission for their recommendation on the continued provision of the MHPB 50% reduction of fees for the 2024 calendar year, based on the planned continued maintenance and improvements they intend to make to the fields.

RECEIVE UPDATE ON THE TRANSPORTATION MASTER PLAN

RECOMMENDATION(S)

1. Receive an update on the Transportation Master Plan; and
2. Provide input to the project team.

REPORT NARRATIVE:

In June 2023, the City contracted with Hexagon Transportation Consultants for creation of the City's first comprehensive Transportation Master Plan. The Plan is intended to provide numerous components, including traffic counts, future traffic modeling, updated speed survey to set speed limits, review of existing transportation infrastructure, specific review and analysis of bike and pedestrian infrastructure, development of transportation priorities for the City, creation of a capital improvement program, and numerous other components. The project has commenced and the purpose of this item is to take initial feedback from the Commission on priorities and issues to be addressed through the Plan. The Commission is specifically looking at the Bicycle and Pedestrian components included within the plan.

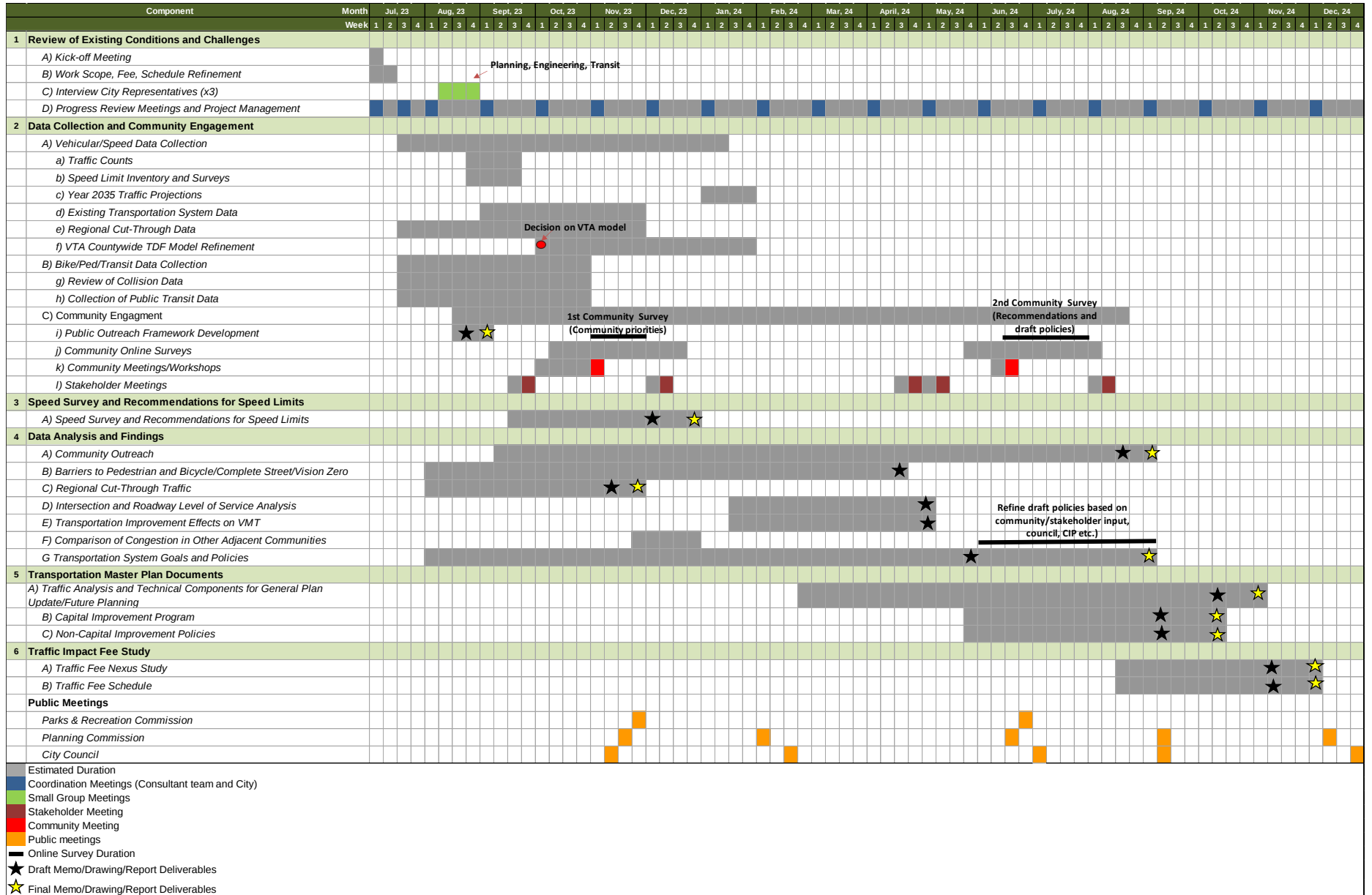
The initial components of the Plan are intended to gather existing data, collect current condition data, and engage with the community to understand community priorities. Known issues the Plan will review and address include: Traffic Congestion & Speeding, Regional Cut-Through Traffic, Biking & Walking Safety, Closing of Pedestrian and Bikeways Gaps, Identifying Transit Needs and Gaps, Prioritize Multi-Modal Inter-City Travel, and Alignment of City Transportation Policies (LOS/VMT/Multi-Modal Travel).

The project is anticipated to take approximately 18 months to complete. The current project schedule is available as Attachment 1. Currently, a significant portion of the activity is focused on community engagement and gathering public input. A stakeholders group of approximately 25 members has been formed. This group will meet 5-6 times to review key components and provide in depth review and feedback to the Project Team. The City has also conducted its first Community Meeting on November 8 and held a Spanish Community Meeting on Thursday, November 16. A community survey is also currently out and available in English and Spanish on the City website at: <https://www.morganhill.ca.gov/2423/39365/Transportation-Master-Plan-Update>.

Following the presentation, it is recommended that the Commission provide feedback on transportation priorities they recommend are addressed in the Plan, as well as the projects the Commission desires to be reviewed through the Plan.



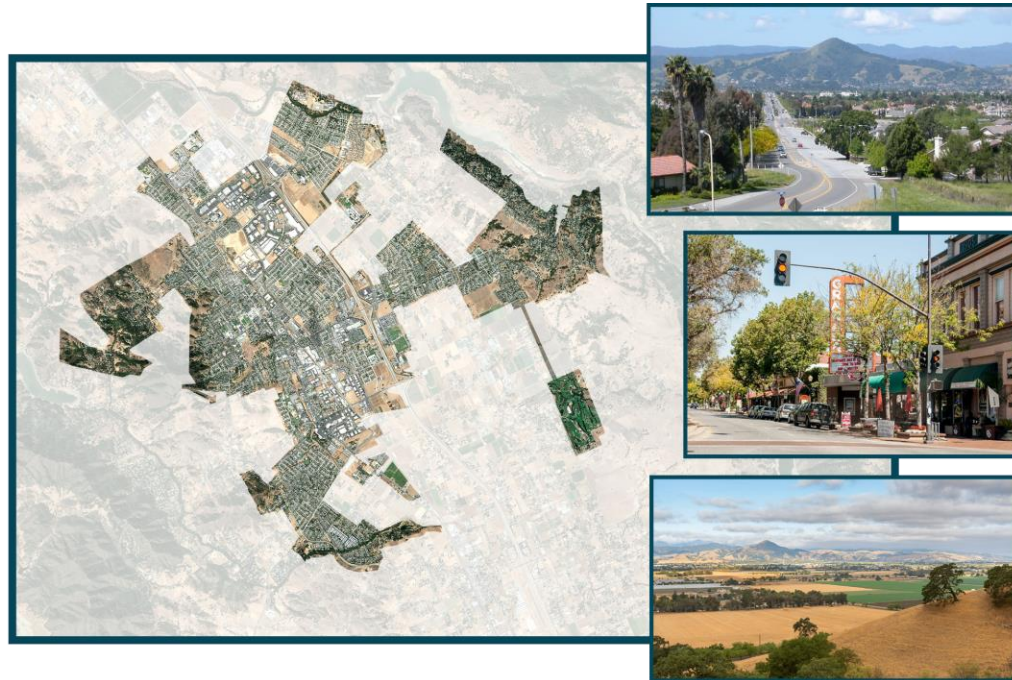
Estimated Project Schedule

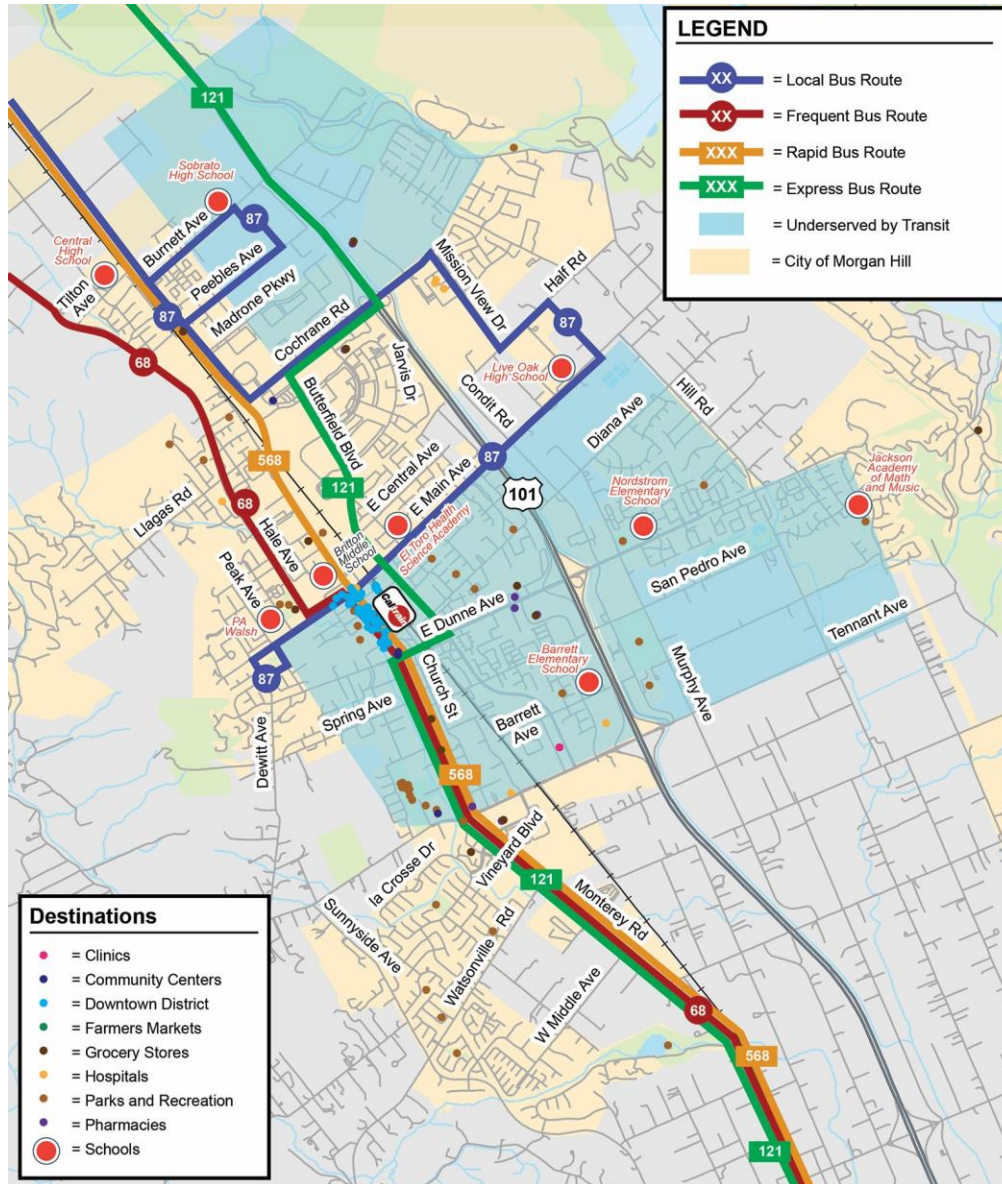

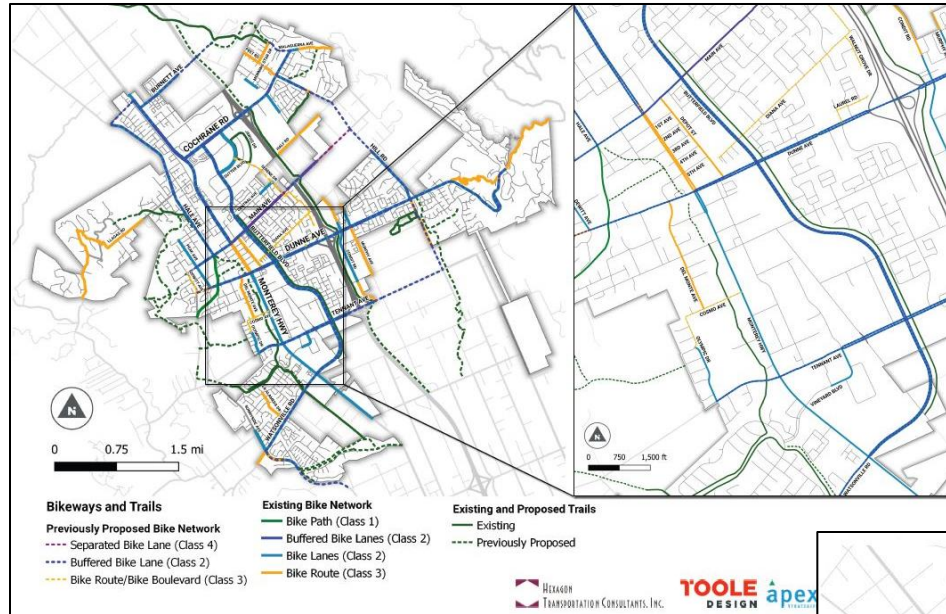


Morgan Hill Transportation Plan

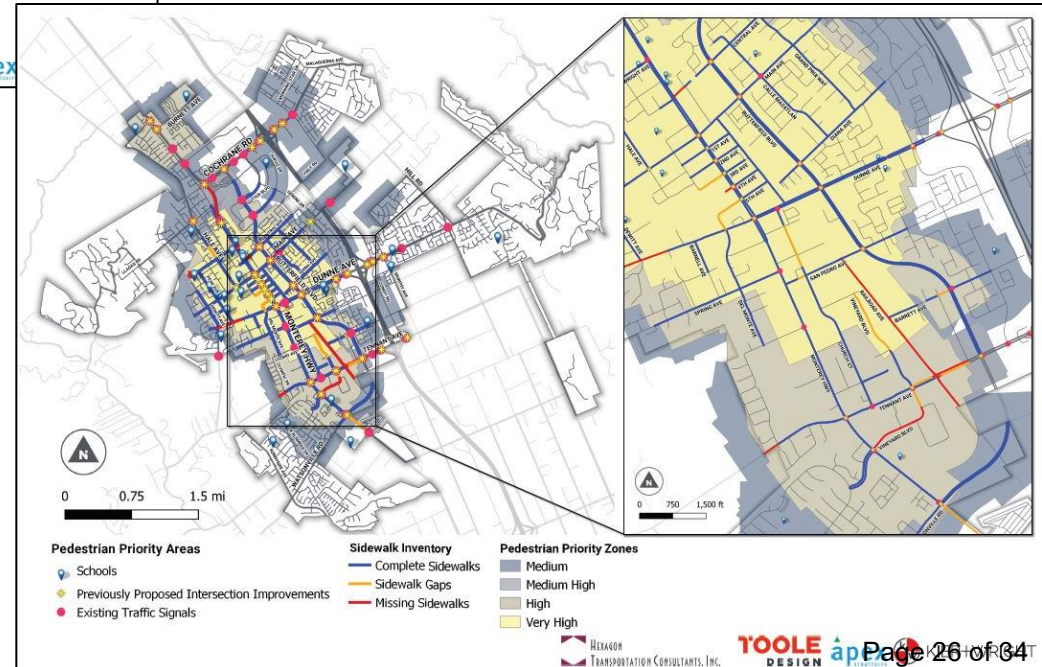

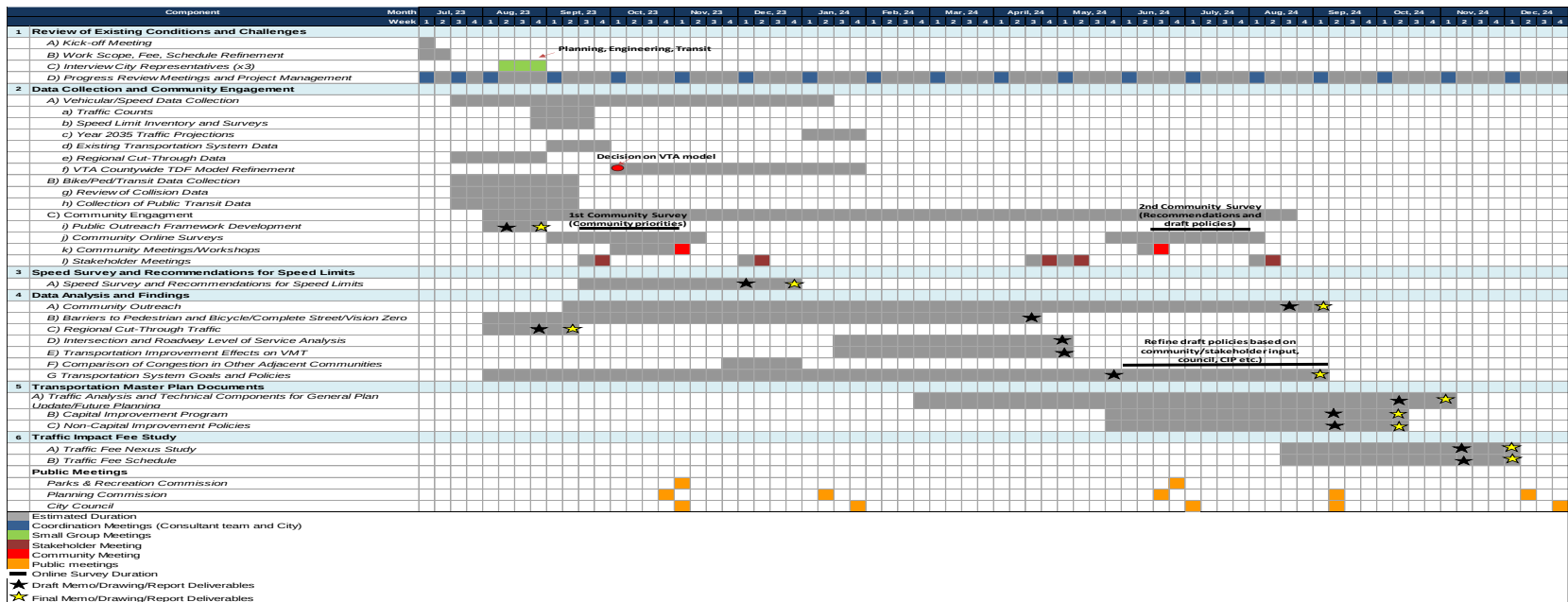

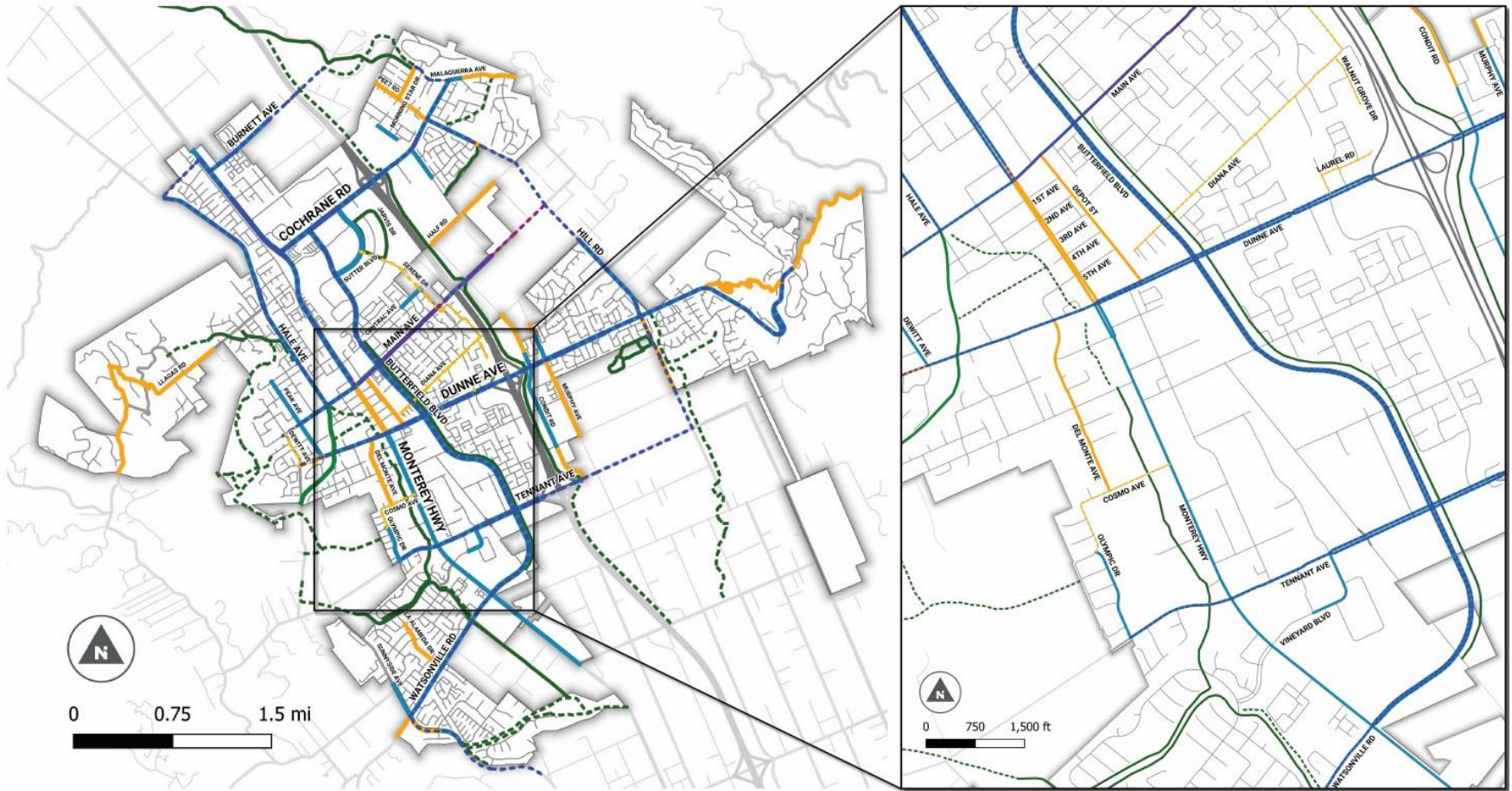

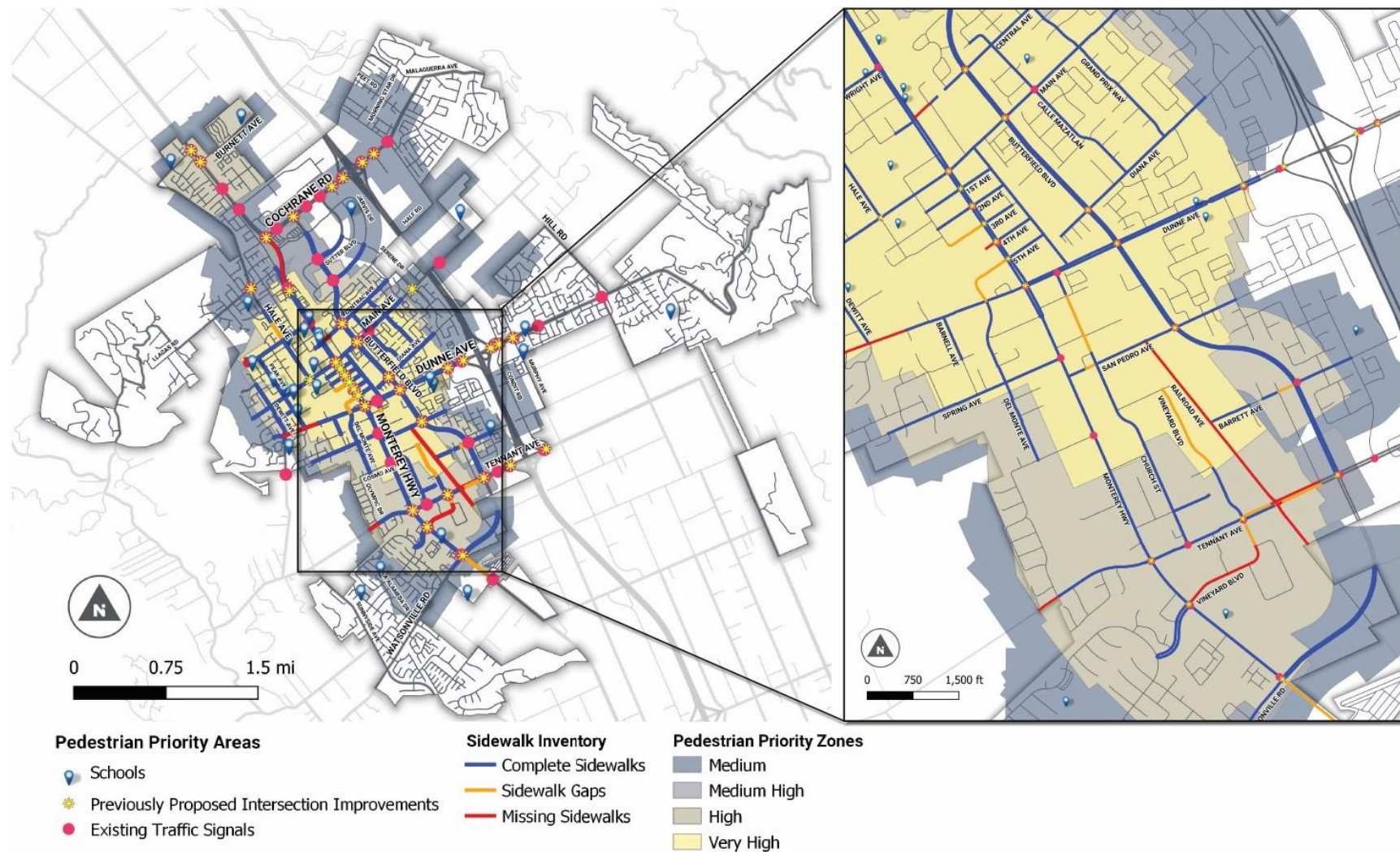

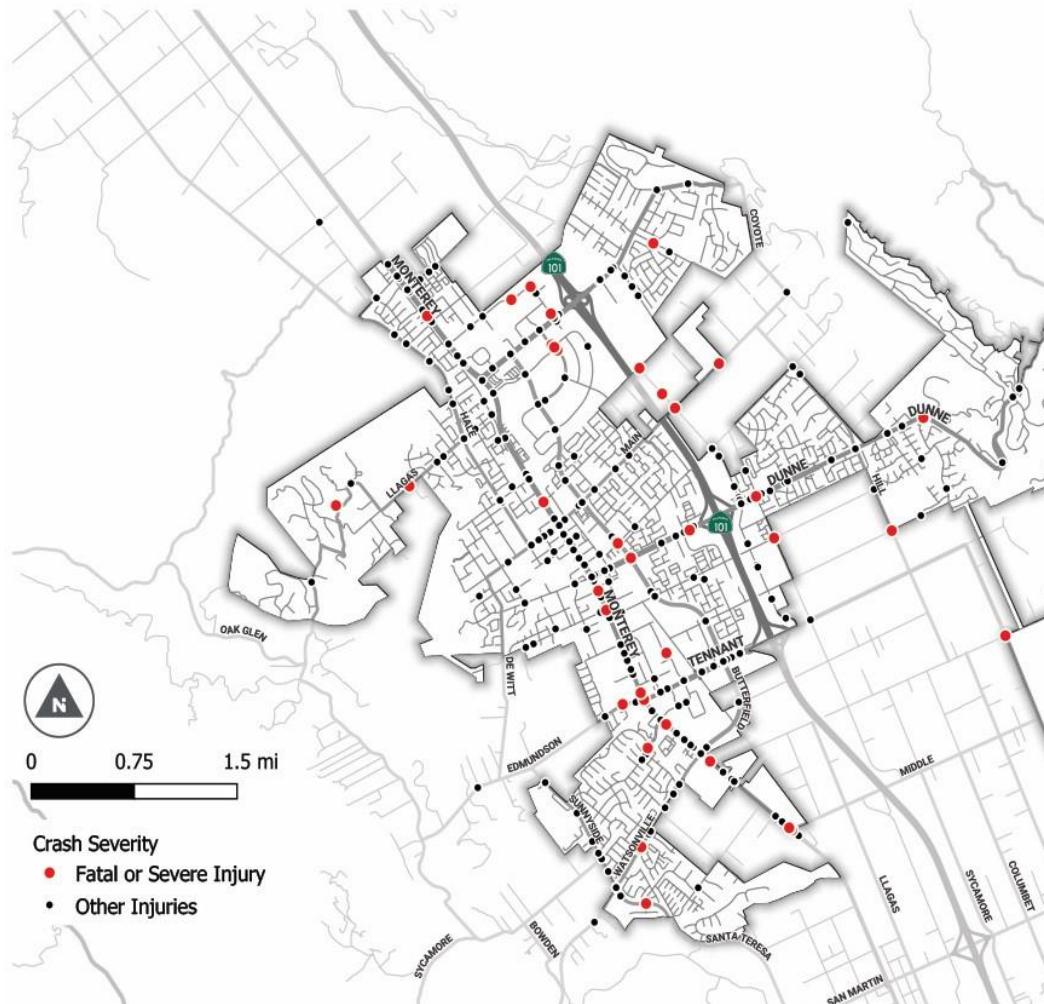
