City Council Policy dictates the order of selection of Chair and Vice Chair for City Commissions. Should a commissioner not wish to serve as Chair or Vice Chair, that individual could pass on his or her “turn” to serve in these roles. The current order per Council Policy to serve as Chair and Vice-Chair is:

1. Commissioner Moniz – Appointed 7/2020 - Current Vice Chair
2. Commissioner Maniar - Appointed 5/2022
Commissioner Vittal - Appointed 5/2022
3. Commissioner Lucido - Appointed 2/2023
4. Commissioner Chabra - Appointed 4/2024
Commissioner Zargar - Appointed 4/2024
5. Commissioner van Keulen – Appointed 4/1998. Last served as Chair in 4/2021.

CITY COUNCIL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

CP 96-02

SUBJECT: POLICY REGARDING TERM AND SELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR OF CITY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

DATE: APRIL 17, 1996

REVISION DATE: DECEMBER 15, 1999, REVIEWED JUNE 27, 2007; AMENDED APRIL 16, 2008

ORIGINATING DEPT: CITY CLERK

In order to provide an efficient method for the selection of Chair and Vice-Chair from the members of the Boards and Commissions, it shall be the policy of the City Council of Morgan Hill to have these officers serve a one (1) year term beginning the first regular meeting date when the Boards and Commissions reorganize; following City Council appointments. A rotation system shall be followed in the selection of the Chair and Vice-Chair. The member who has served the longest on the Board or Commission without serving as Chair during the previous four (4) years shall be selected for the position of Chair. The member second in seniority who has not yet served during the previous four (4) years as Chair shall become Vice-Chair. If the member selected as Vice-Chair is on the Board or Commission at the time the next Chair is selected he/she shall become Chair.

Prior to selection as Chair, a Board or Commission member must serve a minimum of twelve (12) months on the Board or Commission. Each member's seniority shall begin upon the effective date of that member's appointment to the Board or Commission. If two (2) or more members have equal seniority, the Board or Commission shall make the selection. In the event a member otherwise eligible for selection declines the position, the member next in seniority shall be selected. A Board or Commission member will be eligible to serve another term as Chair and Vice Chair provided at least four (4) years have transpired since having previously served as Chair or Vice Chair respectively. Such period may be reduced by one year increments if no other Board or Commission member is eligible to serve due to a recent appointment or because a member otherwise eligible for selection declines the position. If two or more members are eligible to serve another term as Chair, the member who has served the longest on the Board or Commission since having previously served as Chair shall be first in seniority to serve another term as Chair and Vice Chair.

This policy shall remain in effect until modified by the City Council.

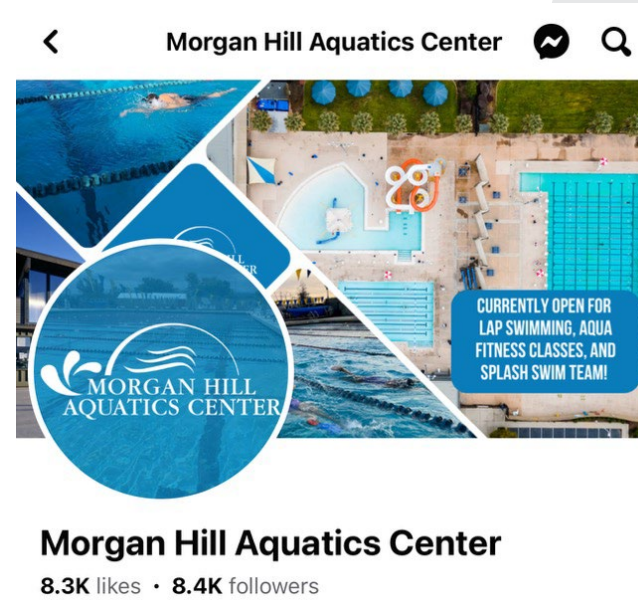

TRANSPORTATION MASTER PLAN UPDATE AND DRAFT GOALS

RECOMMENDATION(S)

Accept presentation by Staff regarding the City's Transportation Master Plan Update and review, discuss, and provide feedback on draft Transportation Master Plan goals.

REPORT NARRATIVE:

In June 2023, the City contracted with Hexagon Transportation Consultants for creation of the City's first comprehensive Transportation Master Plan. The Plan is intended to provide numerous components, including traffic counts, future traffic modeling, updated speed survey to set speed limits, review of existing transportation infrastructure, specific review and analysis of bike and pedestrian infrastructure, development of transportation priorities for the City, creation of a capital improvement program, and numerous other components.

The purpose of this item is to provide the Commission with an opportunity to receive an update on the Plan and provide input and direction on the multiple components of the Plan. These components include:

- Provide general input the Commission is receiving from residents on the Plan
- Provide specific direction and input on the Draft Goals and Strategies (Attachment 1)
- Provide specific direction and input on the Prioritization Criteria (Attachment 2)

The Parks and Recreation Commission also serves the role as the recommending body related Bicycle and Trails items for the City Council, so the Commissions review is most critical in those areas.

The initial months of the process to develop the Plan were used to gather existing data, collect current condition data, and engage with the community to understand community priorities. Known issues the Plan will review and address include: Traffic Congestion & Speeding, Regional Cut-Through Traffic, Biking & Walking Safety, Closing of Pedestrian and Bikeways Gaps, Identifying Transit Needs and Gaps, Prioritize Multi-Modal Inter-City Travel, and Alignment of City Transportation Policies (LOS/VMT/Multi-Modal Travel). Additionally, through engagement with residents, stakeholders, staff, commissions and the Council additional priorities are being established. Significant

- All presentations, meeting notes, handouts from Stakeholder Group Meetings
- The Transportation Demand Forecasting Model Update
- Level of Service Analysis, Policy and Congestion Research
- Cut Through Traffic Destination Study
- Community Survey Results
- Data on Intersection and Roadway Traffic Counts

Goals and Strategies

Based on the purpose of the Plan and best practices in transportation planning combined with analysis of the City's existing data and community concerns expressed through the process, so far, draft strategies and goals have been developed for the Commission's review and input. Through work with the stakeholders group and receipt of community feedback. In addition to concern about improving roadway congestion, significant community concern related to pedestrian & bicycle safety, speeding/collisions, regional cut-through traffic, and gaps in the system exist within the community. While analysis performed as part of the Plan shows that Morgan Hill is safe in comparison to the State and other local jurisdictions, community concern highlights the need to work to address these issues further. The goals and strategies outlined in Attachment 1 are intended to provide the basis for future work in this area. Feedback from the Commission is desired on the draft Goals and Strategies.

Improvement and Strategy Prioritization

Knowing that the City has limited resources to address the overall needs of the City, prioritization is required in all areas. The City has historically operated with a lean team managing transportation and traffic for the City, which requires clear priorities to efficiently operate and provide service to the community. To support the Council, Commission and staff in future decision-making, the development of criteria for transportation projects and strategies is proposed as part of the Plan. The draft criteria outlined in Attachment 2 related to transportation safety, gaps, and operations have been developed to assist in prioritizing future improvements & strategies. Feedback from the Commission is desired on the draft criteria.



Draft TMP Goals, Strategies & Actions

Goal TMP-1: Safety. Eliminate traffic fatalities and reduce the number of non-fatal collisions for all modes within the City.

- **Strategies & Actions TMP-1.1:** Apply road design techniques that reduce excess speeding and accommodate the needs of all road users.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-1.2:** Prioritize projects that are likely to reduce collisions along the City's High Injury Network.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-1.3:** Apply strategies identified in *Vision Zero Morgan Hill*.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-1.4:** Utilize grant funding for pedestrian, bicycle, and vehicle safety educational programming.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-1.5:** Pursue grant funding to implement focused and effective speed reduction marketing campaigns in coordination with police department.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-1.6:** Provide increasing levels of traffic enforcement through the Police Department.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-1.7:** Decrease emergency response times through the implementation of technology.

Goal TMP-2: Increased Transportation Options – Provide a range of high-quality and comfortable bikeways, trails, pedestrian facilities, and local transit options to create a safe, connected, balanced, and convenient transportation system for all ages, abilities, and socioeconomic groups.

- **Strategies & Actions TMP-2.1:** Apply multimodal street design to create high-comfort and low-stress walking and biking facilities and accommodate other forms of micromobility (e.g., e-bikes).
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-2.2:** Create well-connected networks of bikeways and trails that allow for travel across the City of Morgan Hill.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-2.3:** Improve connections between the local bicycle network and regional bicycle network.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-2.4:** Identify and secure long-term funding for the VTA and/or the City to provide local transit service, including MoGo.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-2.5:** Advocate for VTA to provide additional bicycle facilities and close network gaps in Morgan Hill's sphere of influence in the VTA Countywide Bike Plan.

Goal TMP-3: Access to Regional Transit Services and Local Destinations – Enhance access to regional transit services and local destinations like Downtown, schools, parks, and services through improved multimodal connections and local transit options that enable more trips to take place without relying on a private vehicle.

- **Strategies & Actions TMP-3.1:** Invest in complete sidewalks and frequent crossings in pedestrian priority zones.

- **Strategies & Actions TMP-3.2:** Improve first mile/last mile connections to the Morgan Hill Caltrain station and local bus stops.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-3.3:** Prioritize pedestrian and bicycle improvements on roadways identified as ped/bike priority corridors.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-3.4:** Improve access and safety to trailheads.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-3.5:** Proactively encourage the use of non-auto modes of travel to local destinations and schools via community educational and marketing programs.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-3.6:** Complete school area safety assessments to identify pedestrian/bicycle safety improvements.

Goal TMP-4: Congestion Management – Reduce travel time and improve vehicular throughput on city streets by improving intersection and corridor operations, minimizing the extent of regional cut-through traffic, and encouraging mode shift.

- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.1:** Identify and procure funding for increased congestion management resources and driver education within the City.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.2:** Apply feasible physical intersection improvements or signal timing improvements and equipment upgrades to reduce delay along city streets.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.3:** Implement traffic calming measures to discourage speeding and reduce cut-through traffic.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.4:** Design vehicular access on all future roadways to minimize adverse traffic operations and conflicts with pedestrians and bicyclists.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.5:** Ensure the design of all new streets planned as part of the General Plan network and that link new development to existing roadways include bike/ped facilities.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.6:** Participate in regional TDM programs to reduce overall traffic volume by encouraging a shift in travel modes.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.7:** Advocate and lead efforts for the expansion of toll/Express/HOV lanes on Highway 101 to reduce congestion management services.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.8:** Implement VMT policies designed to reduce the number of vehicles on City roadways (including last mile transit service options such as MoGo).
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.9:** Advocate and identify opportunities to support increases in regional transit services, including regional bus service, rail service, and other.
- **Strategies & Actions TMP-4.10:** Coordinate with Santa Clara County on implementing roadway improvements within Morgan Hill's sphere of influence.

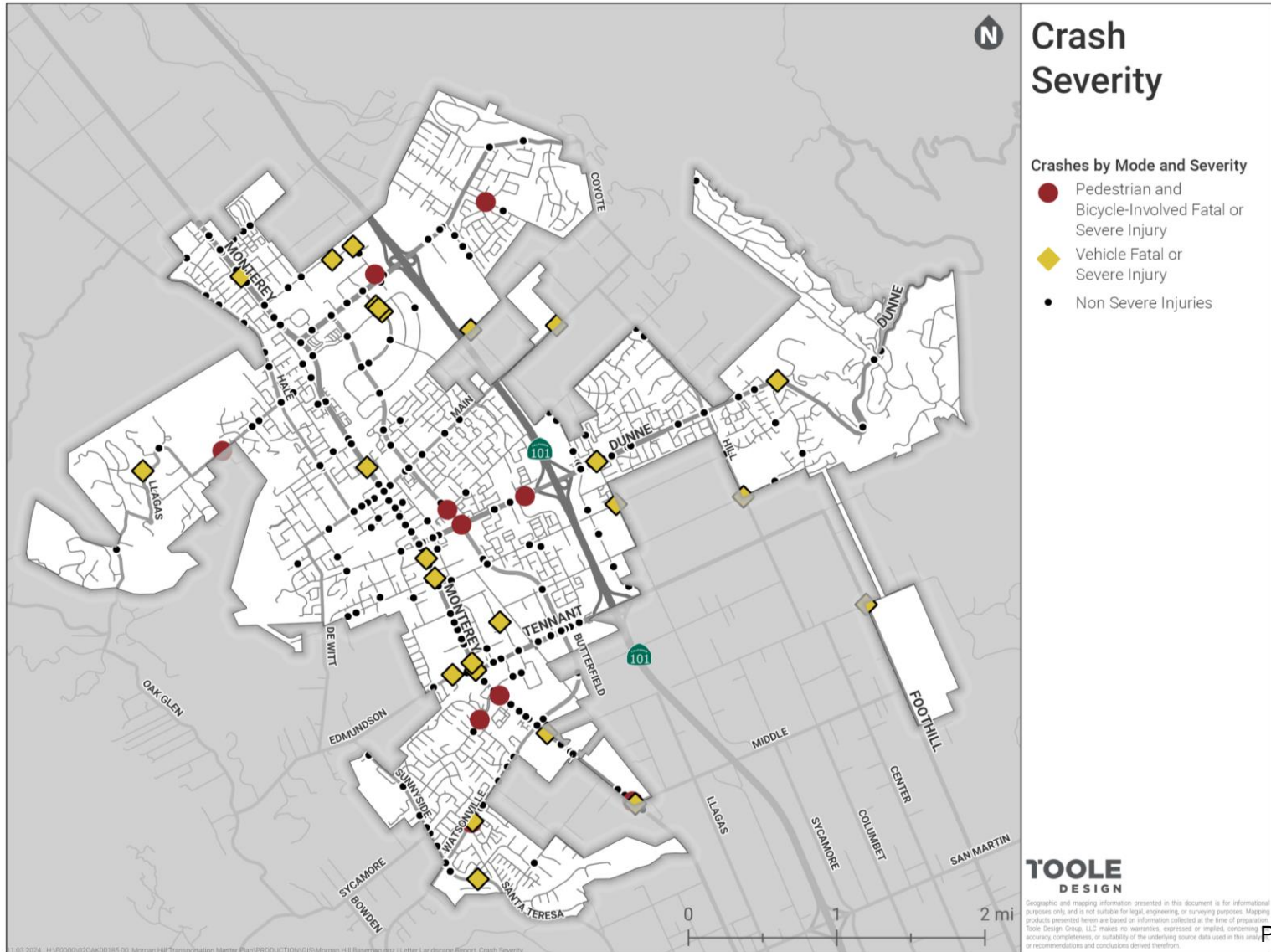

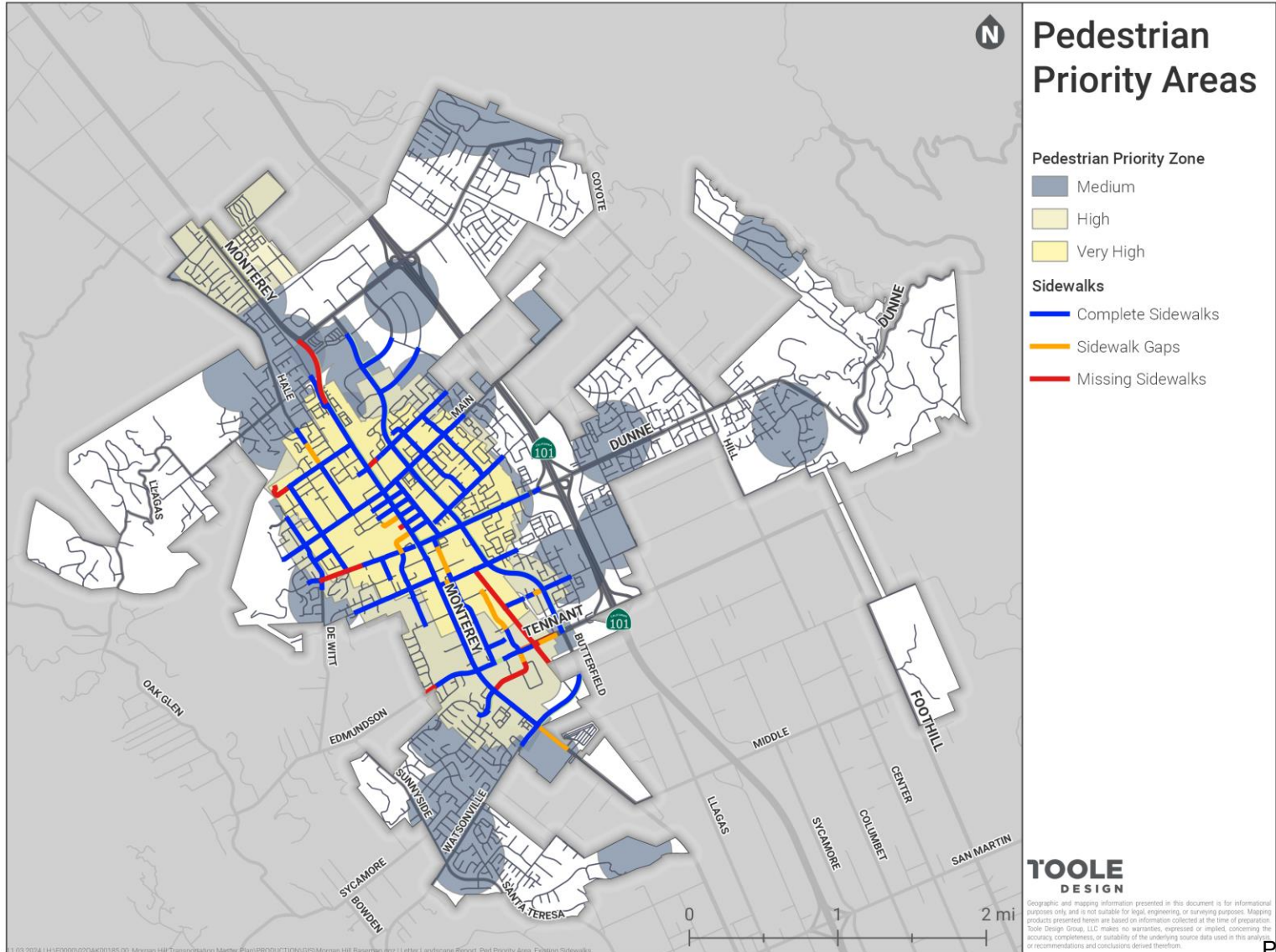


Crash Locations and Severity



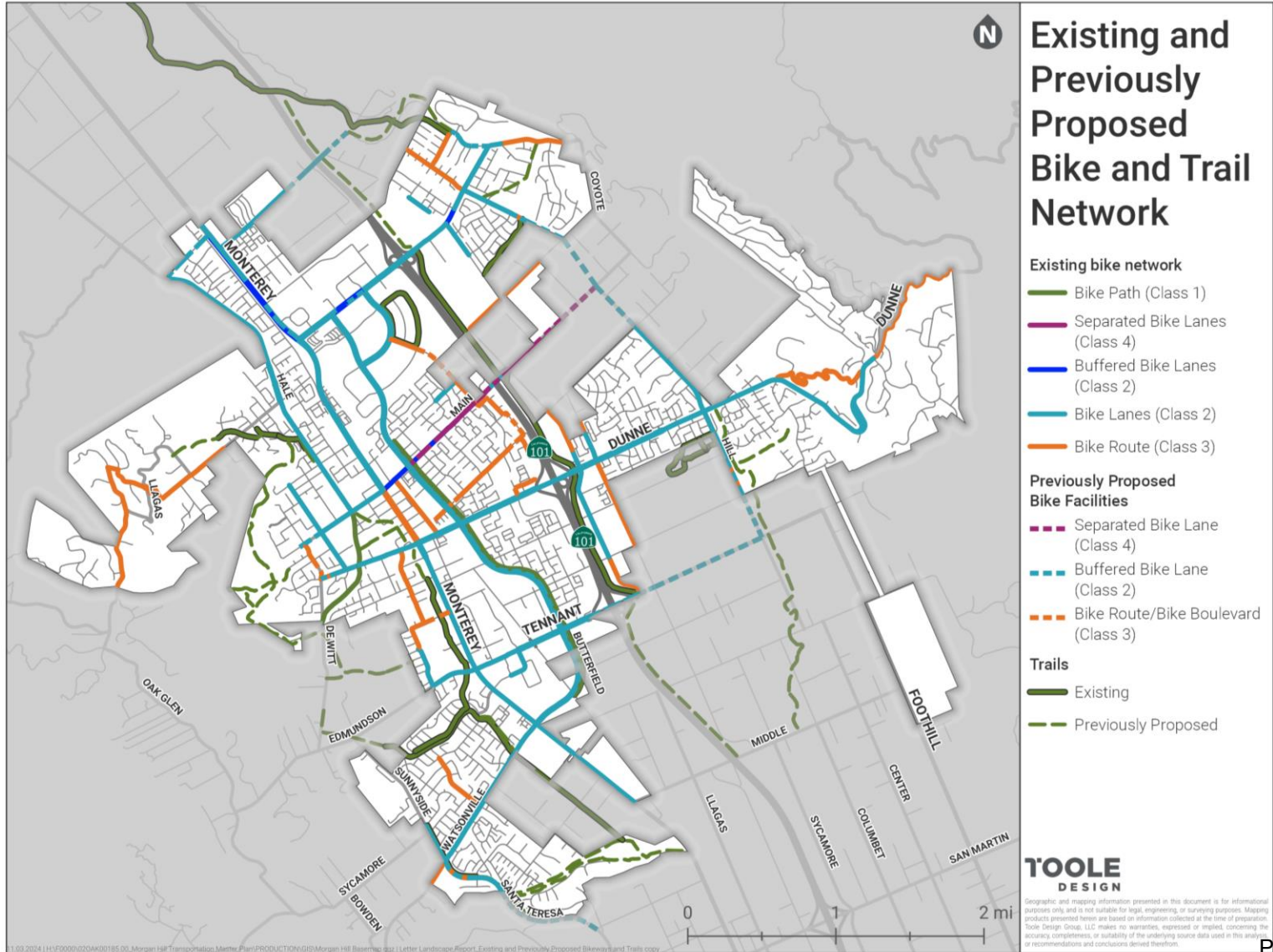


Pedestrian Priority Zones (Existing Sidewalks)



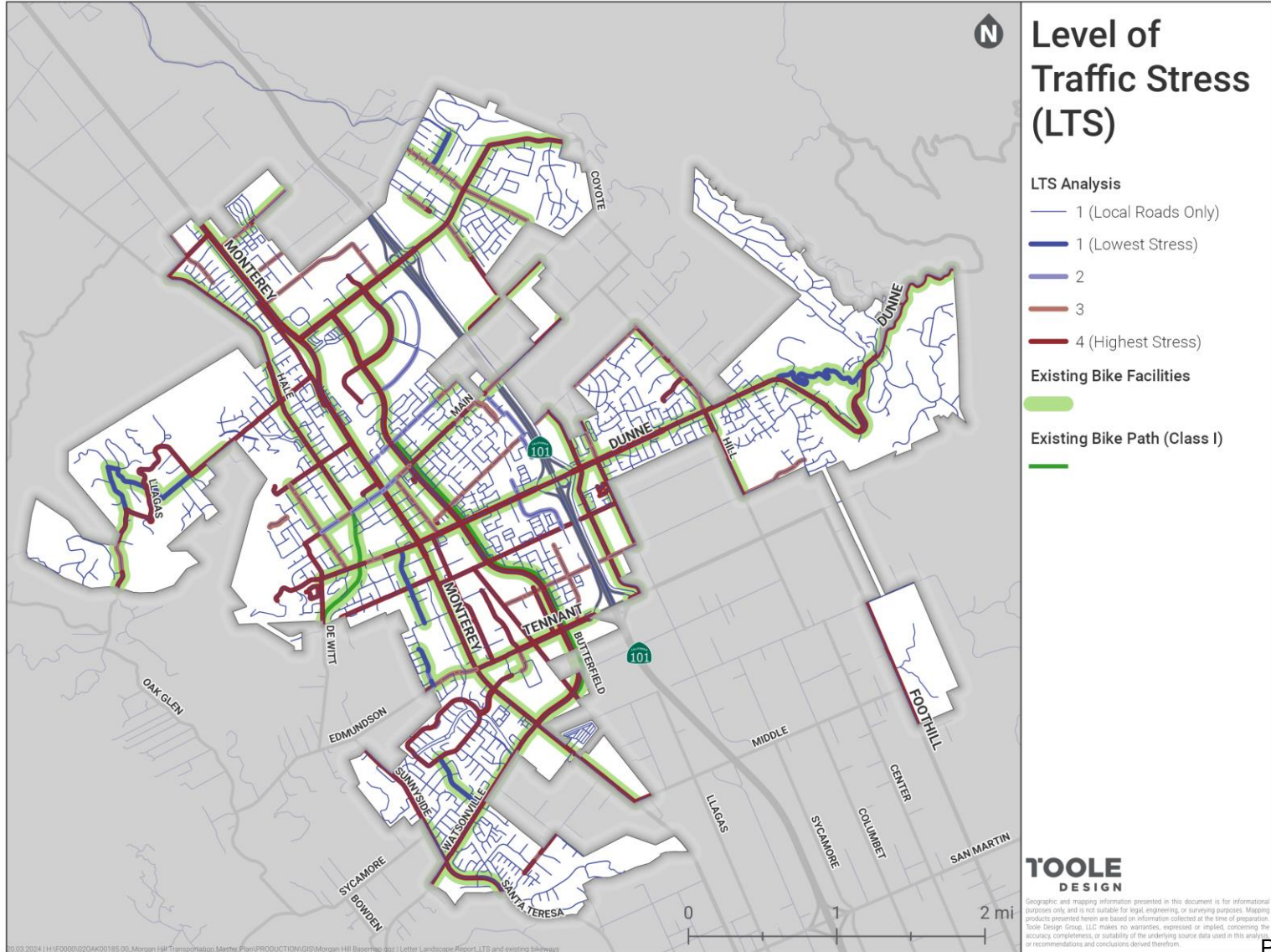


Existing and Previously Proposed Bikeways and Trails

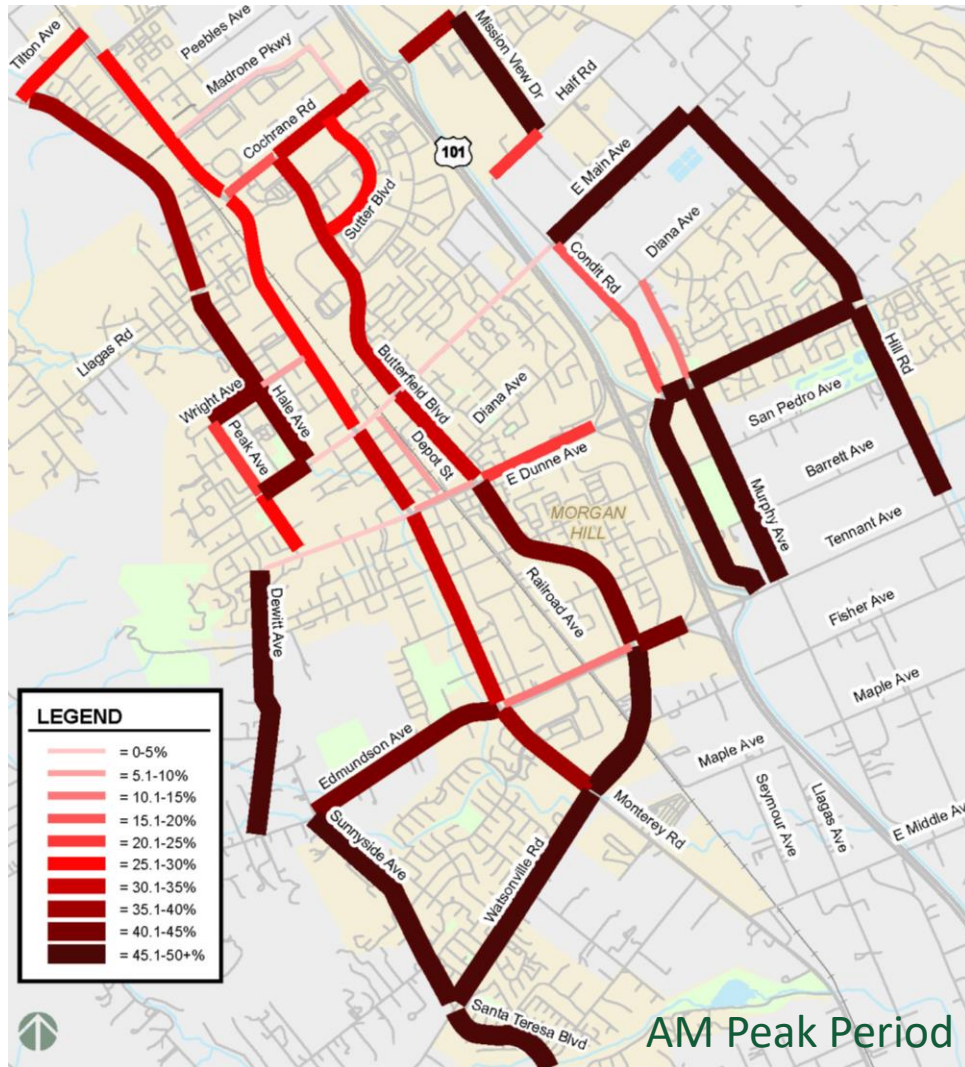
