Crossing Guard Program

Captain Ramirez surveyed thirteen agencies regarding crossing guard programs, reporting his findings from San Jose Police Department having their challenges to retain crossing guard staff. In addition, Captain Ramirez explained the program process, recruiting, budget impact and options neighboring districts use, such as parent volunteers or third-party vendors.

Committee discussions included program management and which organization would oversee/fund the program and Dr. Garcia provided background information on informal conversations leading up to this discussion. Further discussions included number of crossing guards and needs at school sites, mph at schools, safety concerns at intersections around schools, flashing crosswalk signs, MHPD efforts to assist with safety issues and resources to target enforcement, community awareness of cut through traffic and challenges for MHPD.

MHPD Update

Captain Ramirez reported the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is working with SRO Officer Dini and individuals in need or crisis; announced upcoming Run, Hide, Defend classes for school sites; updated on the El Toro Elementary School burglary and youth citations since August 2021 through current day, reporting sixty arrests/citations issued for various charges, of those sixty there were thirty five on school grounds and the Youth Diversion Program sent thirteen juveniles to the program and continue to monitor and lastly, announced the Cadet Ambassador Program has been working downtown for extra support.

Discussions included trends in the increase of citations, repeat offenses, Youth Diversion Program referrals, advocating for long term funding for Youth Diversion Program through the District Attorney's office and offer of support/advocacy to the program.

DETERMINE THAT CONDUCTION OF IN-PERSON MEETINGS WOULD PRESENT A PUBLIC HEALTH RISK AND CONTINUING TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS

RECOMMENDATION(S)

Continue holding committee meetings by teleconference.

BACKGROUND:

In light of the existing state of emergency and the County Health Officer's recommendation, all legislative bodies of the City of Morgan Hill continue to meet remotely in accordance with AB 361. The City has adopted a resolution that directs all legislative bodies subject to the Brown Act, including the City Council, Planning Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, and the Library, Culture, and Arts Commission, to continue to only meet remotely in accordance with AB 361. The resolution also makes the necessary findings under AB 361 by finding that a state of emergency continues to exist relating to COVID-19 and this necessitates that legislative bodies continue to meet remotely. The resolution is consistent with the County Health Officer's recommendation that legislative bodies continue to meet remotely to promote social distancing to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission.

ALTERNATIVE ACTIONS:

The committee could choose to continue its June 16, 2022 meeting to a date certain for an in-person meeting. All meetings going forward would also be in-person.
