Do you know anyone who is unable to physically visit one of our libraries and would like to have library materials delivered to them? Our BookDash home delivery service has recently been expanded to cover the entire SCCLD District, including unincorporated County.



This free service is available to patrons with temporary or long-term illnesses, injuries, medical conditions, disabilities, or other impairments. Those who are immunocompromised, expectant mothers having difficult pregnancies, new mothers who are still recovering, and those without transportation are also eligible.

REPORT NARRATIVE:

Ten City owned traffic signal utility boxes were painted by artists through a project by Leadership Morgan Hill in 2018. Following the initial program by Leadership Morgan Hill, the Library, Culture and Arts Commission developed a program to pair sponsors with local artists to continue painting additional utility boxes within the City.

The Commission has identified another artist/sponsor to paint another utility box. Youth artist Rehat Sra has proposed painting an additional traffic signal utility box. Rehat has taken the initiative to propose this artwork and also initially proposed the associated inspirational phrase "You can choose to be Sweet or Poisonous". Sponsorship of the project will be taken on by Rehat's parents. After discussion at the June Commission meeting, commissioners recommended discussing other potential options for the inspirational phrase. Over the last month, the sub-committee for the Utility Box Art Program discussed other ideas with the artist and are now recommending the inspirational phrase: "There's so mushroom for humanity".

Per the City's Public Art Policy, the Library, Culture and Arts Commission must make a recommendation to the City Council for the approval of public art. The art proposal is included as Attachment 1 for review by the Commission. The artwork could be installed at one of several locations. It is recommended the Commission discuss its preferred location for the proposed artwork if recommended for approval.

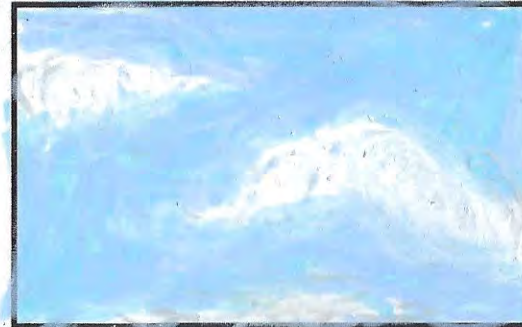
