1. APPROVE IMPACT FEE FINANCING AGREEMENT WITH MORGAN HILL CAR WASH, INC.

Recommendation:

Adopt resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a Sewer and Traffic Impact Fee Financing Agreement, consistent with the Sewer and Traffic Impact Fee Financing Program and Government Code section 53083, with Morgan Hill Car Wash, Inc. for the development of a new automated car wash facility on Caputo Drive.

2. APPROVE VALLEY WATER COST SHARING AGREEMENT FOR TRAIL AND FLOOD CONTROL

Recommendation:

Approve and authorize the City Manager to enter into a cost sharing agreement for \$748,600 with Valley Water for the construction of trails and other infrastructure.

3. APPROVE FIRST AMENDMENT TO CAL-WEST LIGHTING AND SIGNAL MAINTENANCE, INC. AGREEMENT

Recommendation:

Approve and authorize the City Manager to execute and administer the first amendment to the maintenance service agreement with Cal-West Lighting and Signal Maintenance, Inc. for \$100,000, increasing the not to exceed amount to \$550,000 and allow for additional repair services to be performed on an as needed basis and pre-approved by the City maintenance staff.

4. APPROVE FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT WITH WOODARD AND CURRAN INC. FOR DESIGN SERVICES

Recommendation:

Approve and authorize the City Manager to execute and administer the first amendment to service agreement for design professionals with Woodard and Curran, Inc. for additional scope of services for improvements associated with Valley Water's Flood Control Project for \$71,697, increasing the total not to exceed contract amount to \$528,968.

5. APPROVE THIRD AMENDMENT TO BRIGHTVIEW GROUPS 1, 3, AND 6 MAINTENANCE SERVICE AGREEMENT

Recommendation:

1. Determine that competitive bids upon notice would not likely result in a lower price to the City from a responsible bidder or would cause unnecessary expense or delay under the circumstances per Section 3.04.150 (1) of the Morgan Hill Municipal Code; and
2. Approve and authorize the City Manager to execute and administer the third amendment to the maintenance service agreement with Brightview Landscape Services, Inc. extending the agreement for one additional year of service at \$134,183 and increasing the total contract amount to \$528,258; and

6. AWARD BUTTERFIELD BOULEVARD LINEAR PARK EXTENSION PROJECT

Recommendation:

1. Adopt resolution to appropriate an additional \$100,120 in the Park Impact Fund (301) for the Butterfield Boulevard Linear Park Extension Project;
2. Approve the Butterfield Boulevard Linear Park Extension Project Plans and Specifications;
3. Award contract to Terramark General Engineering Contractors, Inc. for the Butterfield Boulevard Linear Park Extension Project in the amount of \$1,439,226;
4. Authorize expenditure of construction contingency funds not to exceed \$143,923; and
5. Authorize the City Manager to execute and administer the construction contract with Terramark General Engineering Contractors, Inc.

7. AWARD SEWER PIPELINE INSPECTION AND CONDITION ASSESSMENT AGREEMENT

Recommendation:

Approve and authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with National Plant Services Inc. in the amount of \$1,174,686 for the development of the sewer pipeline inspection and condition assessment.

8. AWARD TREE MAINTENANCE SERVICES AGREEMENT

Recommendation:

1. Award a Maintenance Services Agreement to A Plus Tree, Inc. for up to \$600,000 (\$300,000 annually for a two-year period) subject to future annual budget appropriations by the City Council; and
2. Authorize the City Manager to execute and administer the said agreement.

9. RESPONSE TO COVID-19, COUNTYWIDE ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE SUPPORT PROGRAM

Recommendation:

1. Receive report and consider funding \$154,917 for the continuation of an established Countywide "Isolation and Quarantine Support Program" by:
 - a. Adopting resolution to appropriate \$107,208 from the General Fund (010); and
 - b. Authorizing expenditure of \$47,709 from the Housing Fund (236);

OR

2. Provide feedback and direct staff to return with an alternative option.

Notice is given, pursuant to Government Code Section 65009, that any challenge of Public Hearing Agenda items in court, may be limited to raising only those issues raised by you or on your behalf at the Public Hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City Council at, or prior to the Public Hearing on these matters.

The time within which judicial review must be sought of the action by the City Council, which acted upon any matter appearing on this agenda is governed by the provisions of Section 1094.6 of the California Code of Civil Procedure.
